Abstract

The CORENET handbook sets out an interactive-adaptive research approach for identifying and reviewing SFSC Golden Cases as learning resources in line with task WP3 as set out in the project proposal. Guidance is provided for identifying SFSC initiatives and their associated advisory/support services that can qualify as GOLDEN CASES for inclusion in the project to support activities planned for WP4 and WP5. The Handbook is in line with **THE CORENET CHARTER** that adopts a definition of an SFSC GOLDEN CASE agreed by Consortium members that is consistent with EU goals, priorities and aspirations and CORENET project objectives and goal. The Handbook: (1) sets out the **INTERACTIVE-ADAPTIVE RESEARCH APPROACH** adopted for preparing the handbook and for reviewing and updating it as the project unfolds; (2) provides a **PROCEDURE ALONG WITH CRITERIA OR FEATURES FOR IDENTIFYING AND CATEGORISING SFSC MODELS** that are in operation across the different political, economic, social, regulatory and cultural contexts across the EU-27; (3) **GUIDANCE FOR IDENTIFYING GOOD ADVISORY AND SUPPORT PRACTICES** in relation to the SFSC models identified that translate into improved performance and increased impact that can be applied consistently across the different political, economic, social, regulatory and cultural contexts across the EU-27; (4) **AN SFSC EVALUATION FORM** for identifying, recording, assessing, monitoring and understanding better advisory and support practices that contribute to improving performance and increasing impact of the GOLDEN CASES selected for inclusion in the CORENET project.
